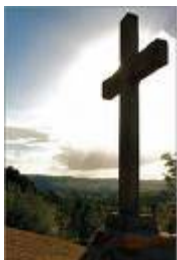

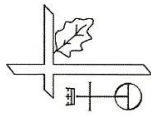

Ministerial Moments Continued

The following week they have been invited to take part in the Youth in Bluegrass Festival at Silver Dollar City. Only 20 groups around the country get invited. Three of the four girls have taken Junior Championships. They will be performing on April 2 at Marissa United Methodist.

As some of you may have noticed, I am reporting more on the people on our Prayer List. This was suggested at a Council meeting and Bobbie Duffie has been tracking down people on the list we don't know so that I can report what is happening with them. Bobbie has also been a great help to me in trying to find music for the choir as we adjust to a new organist and lesser rehearsal schedule.

Maundy Thursday service is April 21 at 7:00PM. We will be celebrating the "hand washing" this year. I have been told that Easter Vigil will be held at St. Paul's in Lebanon this year at 7:00PM, but have not heard any details. Easter Sunrise will be a 7:00AM at 1st Baptist April 24. There will be breakfast following.

As we get closer to Easter we will be thinking more about Jesus' Resurrection and perhaps, about Heaven in general. The Resurrection is confusing to most folks because Jesus is depicted as walking and talking. He eats; and yet, he appears and disappears. He seems to walk through walls. People don't recognize him and yet, he still has the wounds in his hands, feet and side. It might help to remember that the gospels were written generations after Jesus' death with the earliest, Mark, written approximately 70AD. To a large extent what we have is an oral history written down years later. Because of this, we have reports of eye witness accounts but not the actual eye witnesses. Which account is literally accurate doesn't matter. SOMETHING HAPPENED! If it had not, there would not have been a story to tell and the disciples would have all gone home to Galilee to fish or do whatever they had done before.

I recently read a book called, Heaven: Our Enduring Fascination with the Afterlife. The author is Lisa Miller, a religion journalist, not a theologian. Perhaps because she is not a theologian, the book is highly readable as she explores what various theologians and religious leaders have said about Heaven through the ages. She covers not just Christian views on the afterlife, but Jewish and Moslem beliefs as well. Having a study of how views have changed over the centuries as well as different interpretations today in one book is very helpful both in understanding the various viewpoints, as well as helping to clarify ones' own viewpoints on what the afterlife may be like.

It is always good to remember that sometimes our faiths can come together and work as the Children of God we are.
